Serving families through the "Human Touch"

Children's Service Society of Utah has provided safe places for children in our community, since 1884. Several years ago, the University of Chicago released a research study showing for every \$1 invested in child welfare, society receives \$17 back. That's not a bad investment! When we invest in early childhood, ensuring children are in safe places where they can develop properly, there's a decline in other welfare spending. We know by investing in children, they are more successful in



school, less likely to be in the justice system, and become more productive citizens. CSS understood this from inception, and continues to help our communities thrive.

At CSS, we feel the stories we experience, link us together. From the viewpoint of a staff member, or the stories from families receiving services, we're connected. You have your own story and there's a reason you're reading this today. You might be linked to CSS through your personal story, or for your desire to better the lives of others. Whatever your story is, we share a passion for others.

Recently I met an incredibly young person, less than a day old. She was abandoned at the hospital, and placed in the state's custody. For her first week of life, there was no one to hold her, kiss her, or talk to her. The first days of life are crucial in developing the brain, creating connection to others, and building trust. When placed with a foster mother, she was overwhelmed when held, talked to, or touched. She needed to be slowly introduced to what we call the "human touch."

A human touch goes beyond a service because it says that someone is there for us, that someone cares, that someone will help us, and the world is a safe place. That is what Children's Service Society has provided for 137 years. A connection to others that help keep children safe, and provide the opportunity to thrive.

You are part of our story, and help extend our touch to those in need. We are drawn to give by our fabric to ensure children in our community are loved, and cared for. Because of your generosity, no matter what comes our way, we will continue to provide that human touch to those served at Children's Service Society of Utah.


