#### **CAC Course Information**

Care About Childcare will be offering both In-Person and Virtual courses for the Winter quarter (Q3). When registering for courses, please pay close attention to locations and dates.

For Live-Virtual Courses: You will be sent an email 24 hours in advance of your CAC course starting. This email will contain the course link, handouts, code of conduct, and other applicable course information. If you do not receive an email, please contact the training department by 4pm to receive that information.

Please make sure your email address is correct on your Care About Childcare profile. This is the email that all class information will be sent.

#### **CAC-CSS Class Cancelation Policy**

- Care About Childcare (CAC) ~ Children's Service Society will only cancel a class due to extreme weather, disaster, low enrollment, or if an instructor has an emergency and no instructors are available to substitute.
- It is the responsibility of the class participant to call or text 801-707-0265 to inquire whether classes have been cancelled due to weather or disaster.
- Every attempt will be made by a CAC staff member to notify class participants by text, call, or e-mail that a class has been canceled due to low enrollment.
- The decision to cancel classes because of weather or disaster will be made before 4:00 pm on weekdays and 7:30 am on Saturdays.
- The decision to cancel classes because of low enrollment will be made at 24 hours prior to the first day of the course.
- Cancelled sessions will be re-scheduled ASAP, and the participants will be notified by text, call, or email when the class is rescheduled.

Programs and Users should log into their CAC account.
Programs will go to "My Programs" and then to Course Cart.
Providers will go into "Professional Development and then into their course cart.

HOW TO USE YOUR VOUCHERS:

Programs and Users should log into their CAC account then click on "course cart".
Choose how many vouchers you will be using. Then click submit to finish checkout.



#### **CHECKOUT:**

Programs can pay for staff with vouchers.
Staff select "program pay" at checkout, and the program approves or denies.
To use vouchers, the program selects the amount and checks out.

## **Child Care Quality System**

#### What is the Child Care Quality System?

The Child Care Quality System or CCQS is a quality rating system created to give low income families quality child care programs to attend across Utah.

Child care programs participating in the Child Care Quality System (CCQS) may earn a certified quality rating. Programs with a certified quality rating have practices related to positive outcomes for children verified under the direction of the Department of Workforce Services Office of Child Care (OCC). This process includes verification of the caregivers' and directors' education and professional development, the program's family engagement efforts and many other evidence-based best practices.

#### Child Care and Americans with Disabilities Act

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) is a federal civil rights low that Congress passed in 1990. Among other things, the ADA prohibits discrimination by child care centers and family child care providers against individuals with disabilities.

The ADA requires that child care providers not discriminate against persons with disabilities on the basis that they provide children and parents with disabilities with an equal opportunity to participate in the child care programs and services.

The ADA requires that child core providers provide an equal opportunity for each child to participate in the child core program and services.

#### What is T.E.A.C.H.?

#### The T.E.A.C.H. Program:

- · Links education, compensation, and commitment to improving the quality of early childcare.
- · Provides scholarships for early childhood professionals to earn an AS or BS degree in Early Childhood Education.
- Is a partnership for the sharing of expenses between the recipient, their sponsoring program and T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® UTAH.

#### Who is Eligible for a T.E.A.C.H. scholarship?

Any Childcare professional may be eligible if the applicant:

- Is a Utah resident.
- Has a high school diploma or a GED from an accredited school.
- Works a minimum of 20 hours per week.
- Has the support and sponsorship of the program where they are employed.
- Has the desire to earn a degree in Early Childhood Education.

#### What does the T.E.A.C.H. scholarship cover?

#### The scholarship provides:

Most of the cost of tuition and books, a per semester stipend for travel, paid released time support, compensation for contract completion, and counseling and administrative support.

- Social, emotional, and behavioral development:
   Family engagement can help children develop healthy social and emotional skills, as well as behavioral skills.
- Academic achievement: Family engagement can help children improve their academic achievement.
- Language development: Family engagement can help children develop their language skills.
- School readiness: Family engagement can help prepare children for school and transition them to kindergarten.
- Positive attitude toward school: Children who experience family engagement are more likely to have a positive attitude toward school and stay in school longer.

## COMPONIANTE OF + GULLLITY +

Licensing

Program must meet all licensing standards set by the Utah Department of Health and Human Services, Child Care Licensing Program.

Staff Training Staff should participate in training to create quality environments for children.

Professional Development

Programs should provide ongoing professional development and coaching for staff.

Positive Interactions

Programs should have positive interactions and trusting relationships between caregivers and children.

Family Engagement

Programs that incorporate family engagement practices build stronger relationships between families and their communities and help each child's social-emotional and mental well-being.

Classroom Observations Programs that receive observations learn how to create a positive, balanced environment for children and use regular feedback to improve their practices

Teacherchild ratios Programs should have appropriate teacher-child ratios to ensure stfty quality and individual attentions

Emergency Procedures

Programs should have emergency procedures posted and understoood by all.

When you talk with your child and share your interest in everyday things, you reinforce their natural curiosity and encourage them to focus and observe. These skills are part of being a learner for life.



#### **Appointment Predictions**

Waiting for an appointment with the doctor or dentist? Ask your child what might happen. Will the doctor listen to their heart? Will the dentist look at their teeth? Encourage them to share these predictions, then compare them later with what actually happened—especially focusing on what they did to manage successfully.


