Exciting News For CDA Seeking Providers!

The Utah Legislature appropriated \$500,000 in the last legislative session to provide support for individuals working in the early childhood field to complete a pre-school based Child Development Associate (CDA) Credential. How might this benefit you? The Care About Child Care Agencies all across the state will be adding additional classes that will be offered at no cost to providers that apply for and are selected for this new program.

Those accepted in to the program will receive free classes, CDA books, portfolio materials and portfolio support. In addition, the CDA fee of \$425.00 will be paid for on behalf of the candidate when completion of all requirements are demonstrated and they are ready to apply. Providers will have to commit to the entire process, which will take approximately 14 months. This opportunity is for a limited time and there are limited spaces available. Be watching for additional information in the coming weeks through Care About Child Care emails.

All Care About Childcare programs are funded by the Federal Child Care and Development Fund, the Department of Workforce Services, and the Office of Child Care.

Important News

Care About Childcare is now accepting appointments for your **Live Scan Fingerprinting** needs. In order to use CAC services you will need to schedule an appointment. To schedule your appointment please call 801-355-4847.

Things you need to know before your appointment:

- You need to call Child Care Licensing and pay the \$52.75 FBI processing fee for each scan that needs to be completed-for those over the age of 18 –You can call Child Care Licensing at 801-273-6617 to make a payment over the phone
- Submit, Authorize and pay for the Back Ground Screenings which have a fee of \$15.00 per-person- for those over the age of 12- You can call Child Care Licensing at 801-273-6617 to make a payment over the phone
- When scheduling your appointment with CAC, please tell us the exact name AND LOCATION of your program such as: "Center #1" or "Center #2" or if the city it is located in is part of the name-Riverton, Sandy, Redwood etc.

When you come to your appointment you will need to bring:

- A copy of the receipt stating your fees have been paid- there are times we don't see a payment has been made even though it has. A copy from you helps expedite the process.
- State Issued I.D. such as: a Driver's License, Military I.D., or an Identification Card

If you choose to use other agencies to complete your fingerprints you may do so. Below are the instructions and information you will need:

By ink: You will need to take ONE copy of each card to Child Care Licensing located at 3760 S Highland Drive- DO NOT MAIL YOUR CARDS. You can pay the fee at that time or over the phone Live Scan Site: If you chose to go to another location you will need to bring this code with you B2086 and give it to the agency doing your scan. This code links your prints to the Department of Health

Training Opportunities from the Child Care Licensing Program

Classes are held at venues independent of the Child Care Licensing Program. If you have any questions about the class, please do not contact the venue.

All classes are free. Completion of a New Center Provider class is a requirement to get a new center license. Completion of a New Home Provider class is a requirement to get a new family license and to get a new Residential Certificate. New Center Directors must complete a Center Director Training Class. Completion of classes in the licensing rules can count toward the required training hours and topics.

No children are allowed in classes.

Due to changes in federal laws, all providers and caregivers are required to have training in new topics. The 2016 Required Federal Topics classes cover all these topics.

Pre-registration is required. Please register for the class of your choice. If no one is registered within 48 hours, the class will be cancelled.

CAC Online Training Registration Instructions

To register for classes online you must first log-in to the Care About Childcare website at https://www.careaboutchildcare.utah.gov. If you need assistance please call 801-326-4403

- Once you are logged-in, choose the Training Calendar link from the menu on the left side of
 the screen. Each class you see with a shopping cart next to it is available for online registration.
 Clicking on that cart adds that class to your list. When you are done adding the classes you
 wish to register for, you must click on the cart in the green box on the top right of the screen.
 Choose complete registration and follow the instructions to checkout.
- Online registration can only be completed for one person at a time by each person logging-in with their own username and password.
- Be sure to view and/or print your class schedule. Please Note: Online registrations will not receive a confirmation in the mail. Schedules can be viewed by clicking on My Class Registration on the menu to the left of the screen.
- Be sure to print your receipt. It is your only option to get a receipt.
- Once logged in you can also view other things such as your transcript of previous classes
 taken, your progress on the Career Ladder and your Annual Award eligibility date. This is also
 where family providers and center directors can view and update their CAC Marketing Page
 and view and submit verification for quality criteria.

Care About Childcare

- Punctuality / Attendance: I understand that I must be in class at or before the time scheduled for class to begin in order to obtain credit for the class. If I arrive after the time that class is scheduled to begin, I can use the time that I was actually in attendance for licensing credit, but I will have to repeat the full 2 1/2 hour session to get Career Ladder credit for the course. This includes returning on time from breaks and lunch. Class will begin when the trainer determines that it is time to start. I understand that if I am not present during the entire class period, I will not receive Career Ladder credit for the session, and will have to repeat the full 2 1/2 hour session in order to receive credit for the course.
- Disruptive Behavior: I will be respectful to all personnel that support the Professional Development System (ie: Care About Childcare/CCR&R staff. CCPDI staff, OCC staff, etc.). I will not use obscene, profane, threatening, discriminatory, harassing or abusive language. During class, I will be respectful to the trainer and others in attendance during each class session. I will not engage in any conversation or behavior that is disruptive or disrespectful to the trainer or other participants in the class. I will attentively participate in class. I will not text message or make cell phone calls during class time. I understand that I am required to turn my cell phone and/or other electronic devices off or turn them to vibrate during class time. I will limit all cell phone calls to break time or after class time. I will not engage in disruptive private conversations during class time. If I must bring food or drink to class, I will eat quietly and will not allow food or drink to become disruptive or distracting to the trainer or other class participants.
- Illegal Activity/Health & Safety: I understand that any illegal activity, including behavior that threatens the health or safety of the trainer or another class participant before, during or after class will be cause for my immediate expulsion from class and permanent suspension from participation in the Career Ladder and the Professional Development Award, and that such behavior may be reported to law enforcement. I understand that I may be asked to leave a training if my condition prevents me from participating or is disruptive to the class environment.
- Children: I understand that adult training classes are not a developmentally appropriate environment for children of any age. I will not bring children to class.
- Class Roll: I understand that in order to receive credit for each class session, I must sign my full legal name on the roll before class begins. I understand that failure to do so will result in my not receiving credit for the class session. I understand that I may not sign the roll for someone else.
- Confidentiality: I understand that confidentiality is extremely important. I understand that I must keep all names and other identifying information confidential when I am relating a story during class or asking for guidance regarding certain issues. I also understand that it is my responsibility to keep sensitive issues discussed during class in confidence, and not discuss it with family or friends outside of that classroom setting.
- Refunds: I understand that class registration fees are non-refundable. I understand that if I notify CAC/CCR&R a minimum of three days in advance that I am unable to attend a course for which I am registered, that my registration fee may be able to be credited toward another class. I understand that it is my responsibility to contact CAC/CCR&R to make these arrangements.
- Non-Compliance: I understand that, in cases of infractions of a minor severity (behavior that has been determined to be disruptive but not illegal), that I will be allowed one issued verbal warning upon the first violation of the above listed rules. I understand that upon the second such infraction, I will be suspended from participation in the Career Ladder and Training and Professional Development Award for one year from that infraction date. I understand that upon the third such infraction I will be permanently barred from participation in the Career Ladder and Professional Development Award System. The services we offer, and materials we provide, are FREE for providers in licensed programs and designed to assist you through each step of the process!

If you believe pursuing a CDA is right for you, or you are still deciding if it is, please register for an upcoming FREE CDA Orientation offered on the Class Schedule for this quarter. The Orientation covers an overview of the process, the eligibility and training hour requirements, what classes to register for next, how the classes you take fit into the Career Ladder system, etc. Also, at the Orientation, you will be able to create an individual plan for the next CDA Support Workshops to attend as well.

Support Workshops cover various topics including:

- The NAEYC Code of Ethical Conduct
- The 6 Competency Standards and 13 Functional Areas as defined by the CDA Council
- The philosophy of Developmentally Appropriate Practice and how it relates to the CDA
- Organization and components of the Professional Portfolio
- Family Questionnaires
- Verification Visit, including the Observation, Reflective Dialogue, and CDA Exam
- Renewal Procedures

As part of the process, everyone interested in a CDA is required to obtain 120 hours of formal early childhood training. In addition to registering for an upcoming CDA Orientation, you can also begin to register for, and attend, classes listed as Levels 1-3, which will put you on track to have almost all of the 120 hours completed!

Milo's birth mother felt that caring for her child with severe medical issues was more than she was able to handle, and she chose to place him for adoption. The hospital social worker referred her to CSS because of our positive reputation in the community and our expertise in special needs adoptions. We located a family who had experience with Milo's diagnosis, and they were happy to adopt this beautiful child.

Children's Service Society's adoption program has completed more than 2,700 adoptions since 1930. We take great pride in the ethical nature of our adoption services; and more than just following our state laws, we strive to meet high standards of social work practices. It is in part because of these values that CSS is the only private agency in the state of Utah contracted to write home studies for the Utah Division of Child and Family Services.

Connections

Our Connections program is invested in more than just helping CSS's former clients to reunite with biological families separated by adoption. Currently all adoption records in Utah are sealed whether a birthparent wants them to be or not, despite the majority of today's birthparents requesting an open adoption. The Connections program has worked very hard, though yet unsuccessfully, on a bill to allow adoptees access to their adoption records. CSS will continue to strive towards creating ethical adoption practices for all involved in the State of Utah.

- Post-adoption birth parent counseling
- Domestic infant and special needs adoptive placements
- Home studies for Utah DCFS adoptions
- Domestic infant home studies
- Domestic special needs home studies

Since its creation in 2002, the Connections program has helped to facilitate more than 100 adoption reunions.

This guidance is intended to address concerns about the risk for **Zika virus infection in educational settings** in the continental United States and Hawaii, provide educational settings with information for planning activities, and recommend actions that can be taken, in consultation with local public health authorities and government officials, to reduce the potential risk for Zika virus transmission In educational settings and among students.

This guidance provides an overview of the potential roles and responsibilities of public health authorities and school officials, describes prevention measures that schools can take to reduce mosquito exposure, and provides information on responding to a case of travel-associated Zika virus infection or confirmed local mosquito-borne transmission of Zika virus.

Serving young children and their families is what childcare programs are all about. You do what you do because you care. At the Bureau of Child Development in the Utah Department of Health, we understand that, we honor that, and we want to help you do it. Our Early Childhood Utah program currently offers two gamechanging tools to assist you in the good work you're already doing. The Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) and the Strengthening Families Protective Factor Framework can help improve clarity and precision in your work with families.

The Bureau is offering to partner with interested childcare programs in the service of families; we provide access to training, materials, tools, and ongoing support in integrating the ASQ into your program. In addition to providing insight on how to work with a specific child in the moment, screening is the first step to identifying children who could benefit from additional services to improve their outcomes now and down the road.

We're also in the process of applying and adapting the Strengthening Families Protective Factors Framework to a variety of fields across the state. This strengths-based framework puts the work that we do with individual children every day in the larger context of the family, and what each partner, program, and provider contributes to that family's development of the five protective factors:

- Parental Resilience
- Social Connections
- Knowledge of parenting and child development
- Concrete support in times of need
- Social and emotional competence of children

Free Divorce Education for Children from Utah State Courts

When adults go through a divorce, there are programs available to assist them in making the transition, including a class offered through the Utah State Courts. But what about the children of divorcing parents? Nearly 12,000 Utah children are impacted by divorce each year, including more than 5,000 children in Salt Lake County. A gap exists between programs that are available for adults and classes available for children of divorcing parents. Because of this gap children are often left confused and full of mixed emotions when going through the divorce process.

To fill this need, the Utah State Courts has developed a program called Divorce Education for Children. This class is available for children ages 9 to 12 and offered free of charge. The program's curriculum provides children with skills they can use to better communicate their feelings to parents and is designed to minimize the adverse effects divorce has on children. Mental health professionals teach the class with assistance from state court judges and commissioners.

FREE Class Information:

The Divorce Education for Children class is available for children ages 9 to 12 and offered free of charge. The program is taught by a mental health professional and provides children with skills they can use to better communicate their feelings to parents and is designed to minimize the adverse effects divorce has on children. Classes are offered in Logan, Ogden, Provo and Salt Lake City.
